Procedure for {F 6 – Admissions Policy}



Midway College strives to admit only those students we feel can succeed at Midway.

Midway College uses the scores from the American College Test (ACT) or the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) and high school grades to determine the probability for success in college work. A General Education Development (GED) score can be substituted for the high school diploma. The Compass score can be substituted for the ACT / SAT score if the student is 23 years or older.

Admission to the College does not guarantee admission into specific program fields. If a student does not meet all of the requirements for a particular program, she may be invited to campus for an interview with the admissions committee and/or the Department Head of the particular program. The student may discuss her credentials and career goals with the committee during the interview.

HOME SCHOOLED STUDENTS

Midway College does not have set requirements for home schooled students.

A home schooled student's application, transcripts or GED score, as well as ACT / SAT scores are reviewed in the same manner as other student's files.

In the case that the student does not meet the Pre-College Curriculum as listed below, she may be admitted if she has scored well enough on the college entrance exam (ACT/SAT). Each university and college has the discretion of allowing up to 20% of the entering freshmen class to be admitted without having followed the program.

Kentucky law requires that an accurate academic progress report be kept on file for the student. An Attendance register and information on the process followed by public schools to record academic progress reports, and a copy of the forms used by the public schools may be obtained from your local school board.
