Procedure for {G 9 – American Disabilities Act (ADA)}

1. College officials shall base employment decisions on the principles of equal employment opportunity and non-discrimination. The American Disabilities Act (ADA) protects disabled individuals from discrimination and requires covered employers to accommodate “qualified individuals with a disability” unless the accommodation would impose an undue hardship on the employer.
2. The ADA defines a “qualified individual with a disability as an individual with a disability who can, with or without reasonable accommodation, perform the essential functions of the job that such individual holds or desires.
3. Reasonable accommodation is defined as:
 - a. any modification or adjustment to a job application process that enables a qualified individual with a disability to be considered for the position the qualified individual desires; or
 - b. any modification or adjustment to the work environment or to the manner or circumstances under which the position held or desired is customarily performed, that enables an applicant or employee to perform the essential functions of that position.

Reasonable accommodation may include any of the following:

- a. making existing facilities used by the employee readily accessible to and usable by individuals with disabilities;
 - b. job restructuring;
 - c. initiating part-time or modified work schedules;
 - d. acquiring or modifying equipment or devices;
 - e. appropriately adjusting or modifying employment examinations, training materials or local practices;
 - f. providing qualified readers or interpreters;
 - g. reassigning or referring a disabled individual to an active vacant position if all attempts to implement other reasonable accommodations have been unsuccessful.
4. In the event that needs for accommodation or other questions concerning rights under the law arise for faculty, staff, students or visitors, the vice president for business affairs will be contacted.
 5. Prospective students will complete the Application for Admission form indicating any physical condition requiring special accommodations. Prior to application approval, the vice president for business affairs will determine if necessary accommodations are reasonable. If required accommodations are approved, the application will be sent to the vice president and dean of enrollment and the director of student affairs for final processing. *Midway College will provide priority for first-floor housing to any resident student who informs the college of a disability. A list of room assignments for students with disabilities shall be maintained in the Office of Student Affairs and also in the College Safety Officer who responsibilities it shall be to notify any other safety and emergency personnel of the location of students with disabilities. (KRS164.9495).*



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6. If accommodations required by the prospective student are not reasonable and cause unusual hardship to the college, the vice president for business affairs and the vice president for student affairs and enrollment services will discuss and come to final agreement on the application.
7. Period education and training concerning the law will be scheduled by the vice president for business affairs.

Midway College has adopted an internal grievance procedure providing for prompt and equitable resolution of complaints alleging any action prohibited by the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973.

Complaints are to be addressed to the Human Resources Director as the acting EEO Officer to coordinate ADA compliance efforts.

The following criteria must be followed when filing a complaint:

1. A complaint shall be filed in writing with the EEO Officer. It must contain the name and address of the person(s) filing it and briefly describe the alleged violation. Use Grievance Procedure Form as follows.
2. A complaint shall be filed within 20 calendar days after the date of the alleged violation.
3. The EEO Officer will initiate an investigation to determine the validity of the complaint, and in appropriate cases, suggest a resolution.
4. A written determination as to the validity of the complaint and a description of the resolution, if any, shall be issued by the EEO Officer and forwarded to the complainant within 15 calendar days of receipt of the complaint.
5. If the complainant is not satisfied with the decision of the EEO Officer, the individual may file a written request for an appeal stating specific reasons for the appeal. The written appeal is made to the chair of the ADA Policy Committee within 10 calendar days of the receipt of the determination statement from the EEO Officer. Within 10 calendar days of receipt of the request for appeal, the Chair of the ADA Policy Committee shall name a Grievance Committee for the appeal and set the date for the hearing. The Grievance Committee shall include representatives from the faculty, staff and administration. Within 7 calendar days from the close of the hearing, the Grievance Committee shall make its decision known to the chair of the ADA Policy Committee. The chair of the ADA Policy Committee shall inform the individual in writing of the decision of the committee. The decision of the committee is final.
6. The ADA Coordinator/EEO Officer (Director of Human Resources) shall maintain all records related to the complaint.

**REASONABLE ACCOMMODATION BASED ON DISABILITY
REQUEST FORM**

The Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA) and Section 504 Rehabilitation Act of 1973 makes it unlawful to discriminate in employment and in service against a qualified individual with a disability. To be protected under the ADA, an individual must have, have a record of, or be regarded as having a substantial (as opposed to a minor) impairment. A substantial impairment is one that significantly limits or restricts a major life activity. All persons who have self-identified with a documented disability are provided reasonable accommodations.

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PROCEDURES FOR STUDENTS REQUESTING ACCOMMODATIONS

The Americans With Disabilities Act went into effect for Midway College on July 26, 1992. The college follows the general provisions of the law in accommodating its employees, students and campus visitors.

For students requesting accommodations for a disability, the following procedures must be followed:

1. Upon admission to the college, the student must submit to admissions or the academic dean's office the ADA Form 1 stating her request for a reasonable accommodation based on disability.
2. Concurrently, the student must complete ADA Form 2 granting permission to any agency or institution for release of records to Midway College.

Upon receipt of ADA Form 1 and the proper documentation, the academic dean will appoint a committee to develop a plan for meeting the needs of the student. The committee will be composed of the student's advisor, faculty members having the student in class, the ADA coordinator and the student. The committee will convene each semester to determine reasonable accommodations to be provided by the college. The committee will complete ADA Form 3 stating which accommodations were selected as reasonable. At the end of the semester or at the beginning of the next semester, the committee will meet to determine the progress of the student will be evaluated.
