Objective questions (true-false, multiple choice, matching)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Definitions of key terms • Details, such as names and dates • Information presented in diagrams or lists in your notes or readings 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Writing true-false, multiple choice, and matching questions • Working with a study partner to exchange practice questions • Timing yourself as you answer questions
Short-answer items	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Information presented in diagrams or lists in your notes or readings • Definitions of key terms • Details, such as names and dates • Chapter previews, reviews, and study questions in your readings 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Reciting information in full sentences and in your own words • Writing a short summary to practice expressing ideas on paper • Writing answers to the questions you created while previewing your assigned readings • Writing your own questions for fill-in-the blank items, listings, words to define, and short answers • Working with a study partner to exchange practice questions
