

HEERF 2 Funding

As of March 31, 2021:

1. Midway University acknowledges that it signed and returned the Certification and Agreement to receive funds under Section (a)(1) of the CRRSAA program to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students on January 16, 2021. Midway University further affirms that it will disburse the applicable amount of funds designated by this program to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.
2. Midway University received \$446,436 in funding to be used for Student Emergency Financial Aid Grants under the CRRSAA (a)(1) program.
3. Midway University's first reporting period ended on March 31, 2021. As of that date, \$231,611 in CRRSAA funds had been distributed directly to students.
4. As of March 31, 2021, Midway University had a total of 1205 students who were eligible for Title IV funding and could be potentially eligible for CRRSAA funding.
5. As of March 31, 2021, a total of 524 students had received CRRSAA funding.

Students received a form requesting that they choose how to receive their funds (direct cash grant or applied to student account balance) and were notified that if no decision was made by April 30, 2021, the funds would be released as a direct cash grant to the students. Due to guidance issued after the April 30th date, an additional student became eligible and was awarded the Spring allocation.

Students received a form requesting that they choose how to receive their funds (direct cash grant or applied to student account balance) and were notified that if no decision was made by July 31, 2021, the funds will be released as a direct cash grant to the students.
