Explanation: Midway University's Associate Degree of Nursing (ADN) program has several requirements that must be met prior to the student enrolling in nursing specific courses. ***Please return this form to the Admissions Office.***

The requirements **to be considered for admission** to the ADN program are as follows:

- Minimum ACT score of 21 (Students with earned associate, baccalaureate degree or higher are exempt from taking ACT)
- Minimum Cumulative College GPA of 3.0 (calculated from all regionally accredited colleges previously attended)
- Current Kentucky Medicaid Nurse Aide Certification SRNA (CNA) or Certified Medical Assistant Certification (CMA)
- A minimum of 12 college credit hours completed **with grade of C or higher** (from regionally accredited institutions)
 - Must include College Writing I and II, and Anatomy and Physiology I w/Lab
 - Anatomy & Physiology I with lab, Anatomy & Physiology II with lab and Microbiology with lab must have been taken 5 years or less prior to admission to nursing program
- Must be in good standing with the University
- Must pass a criminal background check and urine drug screen
- Submit official high school transcripts or GED score: Transfer students with more than 24 transferrable hours do not need to submit high school transcript.

- Submit official college or university transcripts from a regionally accredited educational institution
